

Extension of green partnership is given the green light by Swindon Council's Cabinet

A partnership, which has created forest meadows and wildlife corridors across Swindon, has been extended.



A partnership, which has created forest meadows and wildlife corridors across Swindon, has been extended under plans approved by councillors at a Swindon Borough cabinet meeting on 8th March.

Swindon Borough Council will now build on its work with Wiltshire Wildlife Trust (the Trust) to greatly expand the number of woodland, grassland and wildflower sites across the Borough.

The partnership, through the Swindon Forest Meadows project, has created new areas of woodland, scrub and grassland at Mouldon Hill, new woodland and river restoration at the Rivermead Flood Storage area, and support for community projects throughout Swindon, including, Shaftesbury Lake, Moredon Meadows Common Farm and Raybrook Meadow,

Following the success of this programme, supported by large numbers of local volunteers, the Council and the Trust have agreed to extend and expand the project.





Under the approved plans, the Trust will identify opportunities for biodiversity enhancements and will then develop and deliver the schemes. The Trust will also lead on the creation of long-term management plans.

In addition to this, plans include a major focus on enhancing the wildlife corridor running from Mouldon Hill Country Park through to the River Ray Parkway. This includes creating new paths that will making it easier for local residents to experience the wildlife along this corridor.

There will also be a strong focus on providing access to nature for our more deprived communities.

Green infrastructure such as forest meadows can help to mitigate climate change by reducing Green House Gas emissions. It is also vital to enable people and wildlife to adapt to the rising temperatures and extreme weather events associated with climate change.

"Wiltshire Wildlife Trust has done a fantastic job running the existing Swindon Forest Meadows project, and this expanded partnership will allow us to significantly improve our biodiversity in the borough, as well as providing countless opportunities for residents of Swindon to be involved.

I want to thank the Trust and the large numbers of fantastic local volunteers for their brilliant work on the project to date and I look forward to seeing even more great habitats being created across Swindon."

Great Crested Newts

Plastic bottles required.

From April you will notice a number of SESSIONS planned to survey Great Crested newt populations during their breeding season. We will use a variety of methods to enable us to safely record populations. One of which is bottle trapping.

Bottle traps are made of empty, clear 2-litre bottles which have the top third/quarter cut off, the tops are inverted into the bottom section of the bottle. This creates a funnel with a narrow bottleneck to encourage newts to enter the bottle. Once inside they are unable to find their way back out again.



Please if you have any cleaned bottles such as these with label removed can we have them to repurpose?

On April 4th from 19:00 we will be at Kings Farm Wood constructing bottle traps such as these. We will also have, torches, moth traps and bat detectors. Please bring along any bottles you may have and enjoy an evening on the reserve.

If you have a number of bottles please let me know so that we can make arrangements for transfer.

Easy – On reasonably level ground. Easy physical activity

Moderate – Generally fairly level ground and short walking distance. Physical work

Hard – Long walk or carrying distance. Steep slopes. Hard physical work.

We supply all tools, equipment materials and any necessary PPE. We cover aspects such as risk assessments, insurance, first aid provision and wellbeing.

We can offer to reimburse for all out of pocket expenses. This can include travel to and from sites (within a reasonable distance). We are not able to reimburse money for refreshments as this is classified as a regular cost that expense that you would have bear even if not volunteering.

No two days are the same and there is always something to find and explore. The social side of volunteering is very much encouraged.
